SO WHAT

- Can you name the people groups that are in your sphere of influence? What do you think will be the most effective way to share Jesus to them?
- How have you experienced God as your Source? Are you fully convinced that God is the Source of all your needs?
- Do you think discipleship is worth your time and effort? Why or why not?

NOW WHAT

- How can you make disciples within your sphere of influence?
- What personal stories can you share to people to encourage them to look to God as their ultimate Source?
- Who among your family, friends, classmates, or colleagues need to know about God's love? Make a list, pray for these people, and believe God for an opportunity to share the gospel.

PRAYER

- Name the people groups within your community or sphere of influence. Begin to pray for open doors and strategy for the gospel to enter these worlds.
- Ask God for the grace to make you fruitful and effective in making disciples (John 15:8).
- Pray that those whom you are leading will also lead their own Victory groups soon.

Christ commanded His disciples to baptize His followers in
the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
Baptizing in the name meant immersing them in the person
and identity of God. In other words, discipleship is about
introducing God to every person we get in touch with.
What do we share about God (1 Corinthians 8:6)?

Discipleship is teaching people to grow in their relationship with God.

"... and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you...." MATTHEW 28:20

Discipleship is not about programs and activities—it is about having a lifelong relationship with God and guiding others to do the same. The foundation of discipleship is the Good News that God has sacrificed His only Son to take our place on the cross out of His great love for us (1 John 4:9,10). What is the story of your relationship with God? How do you think will this encourage others to have a relationship with God as well?
