What does the Bible say?

Jacob had a unique experience in his wrestling bout with the angel of the God. This angel of God alluded to Jesus even before Him being born as a man on earth. The attributes that described the angel of God showed this. After wrestling with the angel, Jacob was never the same again. What lessons can we learn from Jacob's experience?

• Wrestling with God changes our outlook.

Then the man said, "Let me go, for it is daybreak." But Jacob replied, "I will not let you go unless you bless me."

Genesis 32:26

when something collides with a material stronger than itself, which is
changed? This is what happened to Jacob. Upon realizing that he was
wrestling with God, he changed his position from struggling away from
the man to clinging on to him. Why is it reasonable to surrender our own
outlook to God's wisdom and ways (Isaiah 55:9)?

Wrestling with God changes our identity.

Then the man said, "Your name will no longer be Jacob, but Israel, because you have struggled with God and with humans and have overcome."

Genesis 32:28

After Jacob struggled with God and clung to Him for blessing, God changed his identity by changing his name to Israel—the name that God's chosen nation will eventually carry. Notice that it was God who did the change. Who knows our true identity? What can we follow from Jacob's response so God can restore us to His intended purposes for us?

²⁹Jacob said, "Please tell me your name." But he replied, "Why do you ask my name?" Then he blessed him there. ³⁰So Jacob called the place Peniel, saying, "It is because I saw God face to face, and yet my life was spared." ³¹The sun rose above him as he passed Peniel, and he was limping because of his hip.

Genesis 32:29-31

The name "Jacob" means "deceiver" which God changed into Israel, where
His chosen people is named after. After God touched Jacob's hip, he never
walked the same way again not just physically but spiritually. An encounte
with God is what we need to be changed in our character and to become
more and more like Him. Recall a time when you first had an encounter
with God. How did this affect your life?
