SO WHAT

- How does Romans 6:1 apply in your life?
- What does the Bible say about temptation (1 Corinthians 10:13)? How does this encourage you to say 'no' to sin?
- How does this promise help you approach God whenever you fall into temptation (1 John 1:9)?

NOW WHAT

- What other things in your life do you feel need to be surrendered to God? How can you respond in grace?
- Everyone faces temptation; no one is exempt. What have you learned from this lesson that can help you say 'no' to sin and how will you apply it from now on?
- Who can you encourage this week to continue living for God and walking in His ways? Stand with that person in prayer.

PRAYER

- Acknowledge your need for the Holy Spirit and ask Him to empower you to say 'no' whenever you are faced with temptation.
- Pray for each other in your Victory group, that everyone will walk in the grace and power that the Holy Spirit gives to live a godly life.
- Believe God for strength and encouragement to continue living for Him despite the odds that sometimes put us down.

WHAT

The grace of God has been freely given to us based on the finished work of Jesus Christ on the cross. It teaches us that all our sins are forgiven and we are fully accepted by God. Grace teaches us to say 'no' to sin.

¹What shall we say, then? Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase? ²By no means! We are those who have died to sin; how can we live in it any longer? ROMANS 6:1,2
